#### MARITIME RADIO TRAINING - A FULL HOUSE

#### April 13, 2024

LRC's coaches and safety boat driver took a full-day course on Maritime Radio operations at the boathouse on Saturday. Due to us rowing so close to USA, our cellphones may not always work when we need it. The maritime radio will allow

safety boat drivers and coaches to contact other nearby boats or the coast guard in case of emergencies. This training is mandatory for coaches as part of the required safety training. # MASTERING THE STROKE

YOUR SOURCE FOR ROWING TIPS & CHALLENGES

#### Weather Conditions & the Waterway

The month of April has been quite windy and rainy! Sometimes rowing conditions can't be determined until the boathouse captain is at the boathouse and sees the water for themselves, to ensure there are **no whitecaps**. While they always make an effort to arrive early to send out the cancellation notice, they may also have other commitments that prevent them from doing so!

#### Weather Conditions (by Sue Whitehead)

I've learned to look at the wind direction and speed, I usually look a couple of hours before I go. A general rule of thumb for me is, if the wind speeds are:

- between **15 20 km/h from the South, Southwest, & Southeast**, there is a HIGH probability of not rowing.
- more than 20 km/h from any other direction, likely not rowing

I like winds between calm to 15 km/h coming from any direction that doesn't have south in its name. I know the boathouse captains and safety boat drivers do their utmost to get the cancellation out early but it probably won't be an hour before. The weather app I use is The Weather Channel and I always look at LaSalle weather. Happy rowing everyone!

#### The Waterway

See below for a course map. This is also posted by the door to the dock.

- The Bay is the entire area within the yellow circle.
- Course 1 aka "to the Green Shed". From the dock, <u>always head straight across the bay</u> (towards Fighting Island) and wait on the shore-side of the buoy until the safety all rowers and the safety boat are nearby.
- Course 2 aka "Grassy Island". From the dock, row straight for the tugboats and stick closer to shore. Look out for overhanging tree branches when rowing along Grassy Island.
- Course 3 aka "to the cottages". From the dock, head straight across the bay and row to along the shore of Fighting Island
- It is also mapped out on Google Earth with Buoys and Landmarks (Thanks Mat!)
